

Head-Royce South Campus Plan

In 2018, Head-Royce School launched an exciting initiative to expand its campus by eight acres and develop a state-of-the-art, multi-dimensional instructional environment designed for the future of education. The new South Campus will grow our K-12 academic programs in hands-on experiential learning, further increase and attract a diverse student population and invest in infrastructure enhancements to improve traffic flow and wildfire protections for both the School and neighborhood.

SOUTH CAMPUS PROJECT FACTS

- Renovation of three historical buildings, transforming them into 25,000 square feet of new K-12 classroom space featuring a STEM Center, maker labs, huddle rooms, a welcome center and a community collaboration hub.
- Construction of a new 12,000 square foot Performing Arts Center.
- Addition of eight acres of wooded areas with mature trees and inviting open spaces that will facilitate extensive outdoor learning opportunities.
- Development of a two-lane loop driveway encircling the south side of campus to facilitate student pick-up/drop off and ease traffic on Lincoln Avenue.
- Utilization of modern fire protection systems and fire-resistive materials in the construction of new and renovated buildings.
- Continuation of the South Campus site's long-standing use as a school and hub for youth services.

EXPANDING OPPORTUNITIES TO LEARN

The new South Campus will allow Head-Royce to slowly increase student enrollment by 350 students over a 20-year period, which also creates nearly 100 new permanent student scholarships, increases programmatic opportunities and offers more equitable access to families of all backgrounds.



COMMUNITY INVESTMENTS

The South Campus presents an opportunity to invest in important infrastructure improvements that will benefit students, parents and neighbors alike. These include a new two-lane loop driveway that will remove traffic from Lincoln Avenue and ease neighborhood congestion as well as the creation of fire breaks, fire-safe landscaping and vegetation management throughout new open spaces and pathways.

The City of Oakland has released its Final Environmental Impact Report (FEIR) for the South Campus plan and Head-Royce needs your help to bring the project across the finish line!
